Parent/Teacher Meetings: Our annual formal parent/teacher meetings normally take place in November. This year, we hope to hold face to face meetings set over two or three days. Digital Learning: To celebrate EU Code Week 2022 all of our pupils engaged in different coding activities throughout this two week period. Some pupils enjoyed coding with our Lego Wedo Kits and our Bee Bots while others completed coding projects using Scratch Junior and Minecraft Hour of Code Challenge. For the month of October all classes were also very busy preparing their digital books to share with each other using Book Creator. The children will continue to develop their digital literacy skills and knowledge throughout the school year.

Primary Debating Festival: Our school debating team took part in their first debate this month against Maynooth Presentation Primary School. The motion for debate was ‘School Uniforms Should be a Thing of the Past’. Both teams were excellent on the day with Maynooth Presentation Primary proposing the motion and Sallins N.S. in opposition. Unfortunately the motion was carried on the day. The team looks forward to their next debate in November.

NEPS (National Educational Psychological Services): NEPS has informed me that we do not currently have a NEPS psychologist assigned to our school. We will continue to support all children in the school. If we are assigned a NEPS psychologist later in the year I will inform you.

Aladdin Connect: The feedback, so far, on the Aladdin Connect app has been very positive. Parents have commented that it makes communication between home and school extremely easy. If you have not signed up to it please do so as parent/teacher meetings will be organised on it and your child’s school report will be available through the app also later in the year.

Retirement: Mrs Rionagh Macnamara is retiring at Hallowe’en. I am sure you join me in expressing our gratitude for the work and support Mrs Macnamara has given to St Laurence’s NS pupils, families and staff over the last 19 years. We hope Mrs Macnamara will have the good health to enjoy a long and happy retirement.

Rainy Day Collections: As the year progresses from autumn into winter I ask that parents/guardians who are collecting children by car from the school, at 2pm and 3pm, to please be mindful of pedestrians, other road users and rules of the road. Recently there was a shower at 3pm and a driver parked in the yellow box at the entrance to the school. This was at best thoughtless and inconvenient and potentially hazardous, as the school gate was totally blocked. Please do not park in the yellow box in front of the school. Also you are asked to leave space for the buses to park and help keep traffic flowing at the bus turning point (roundabout).

Firefighter Visit: Firefighter Zippy spoke to our three 6th classes on Wednesday 12th October. He highlighted some common practices in homes that are hazardous and gave advice on the importance of having an escape plan, in the event of a fire.

Friendship Week: For the first time ever, we held a ‘Friendship Week’ in our school. This ran from Monday 3rd of October to Friday 7th of October. During this week the emphasis was on showing kindness, being friendly, making friends and anti-bullying. The Student Council led, organised and promoted ‘Friendship Week’. Classes participated by encouraging kindness, learning friendship themed songs and poems, reading stories, making art displays, having kindness jars in classes, picking the name of someone in their class out of a hat to be an extra kind ‘secret friend’ to and by performing random acts of kindness.

The Student Council and prefects gave out ‘Kindness Award’ stickers throughout the week to reward any child they noticed being kind, friendly and inclusive.

‘Friendship Week’ was a great success and was a positive, fun and enjoyable week for all!
