The schoolbooks remain the property of the school so they may be re-used in future years. Children from 1st class upwards will need to supply their own pencils, pens, etc.

School Uniform: Junior Infants, Senior Infants and 1st classes will have the option of wearing the full school uniform or the school tracksuit each day. We have ties available from the school office, costing €5, should you need them.
